OVERVIEW

At Lee Stream School, we are proud of the progress our students have made this year. Our focus is always on providing an engaging and supportive learning environment where ākonga feel confident in their abilities and excited about learning. This report looks at how our students have progressed across the curriculum and highlights areas of strength and focus for 2025.

STUDENT PROGRESS AND ACHIEVEMENT ACROSS THE CURRICULUM:

READING

WHAT THE DATA SHOWS:

Every student is working within their expected curriculum level for reading! This shows the strength of our structured literacy approach and small-group teaching.

Students are reading fluently and accurately, tackling a variety of texts with confidence.

Our younger students have thrived in the Little Learners Love Literacy programme, which has given them a solid foundation in decoding and early comprehension skills.

NEXT STEPS FOR 2025:

- Focus on deepening comprehension—making connections, inferring meaning, and discussing texts at a deeper level.
- Continue using targeted small-group reading sessions to give every child the support they need.



STUDENT PROGRESS AND ACHIEVEMENT ACROSS THE CURRICULUM:

WRITING

WHAT THE DATA SHOWS:

- ✍ Most students (80%) are working within or beyond their expected level in writing.
- ✍ We've seen fantastic progress this year, with students developing their ideas, structuring their writing, and building fluency.
- ✍ Students have enjoyed writing in a variety of genres, from narratives to reports, building confidence in different styles of communication.

NEXT STEPS FOR 2025:

- Keep encouraging real-world writing opportunities to make learning even more meaningful.
- Provide extra scaffolding for students still developing confidence in writing.



STUDENT PROGRESS AND ACHIEVEMENT ACROSS THE CURRICULUM:

MATHS

WHAT THE DATA SHOWS:

90% of students are working within or beyond the expected level for maths!
This is a great result.

Daily maths practice and problem-solving activities have helped build strong number knowledge and confidence.

Students enjoy hands-on learning with Numicon and Manga High, making maths engaging and practical.

NEXT STEPS FOR 2025:

- Continue building problem-solving skills to stretch students' thinking.
- Provide extra challenges for those ready to extend their learning further.



ATTENDANCE AND ENGAGEMENT

What it looks like:

🎯 Regular attendance is improving! 83% of students attended more than 90% of Term 4, up from 77% in 2023.

🎯 92% of students were on time to class, compared to 23% in 2023—a massive improvement!

🎯 Students in Years 2, 3, 5, and 8 had the highest attendance (100%).

Supporting Attendance at School

- Clear communication with whānau has helped ensure attendance remains a focus.
- We continue to monitor and support students who need extra encouragement to be at school every day.
- When students attend regularly, they feel more confident in their learning and social connections.

Next steps for 2025:

📌 Keep improving attendance, with a goal of 80% of students attending 90% or more of the year (in line with the Government's 2030 target).

📌 Support families in reducing absences where possible, so students don't miss key learning.

SUPPORTING EVERY LEARNER

At Lee Stream School, every child is important. We make sure students get the right support at the right time, including:

- 💡 Small-group literacy and maths support for students who need a boost.
- 💡 One-on-one writing sessions to help students gain confidence.
- 💡 Hands-on learning projects like the gully restoration and William Pike Challenge, which build real-world skills.

◆ Next steps for 2025:

- 📌 Keep offering personalised support to make sure every student thrives.
- 📌 Strengthen goal-setting and reflection, so students can take ownership of their learning journey.
- 📌 BOT continuing to fund the .6 position to maximise teaching time, awesome teacher to student ratios!

WHAT'S GOING WELL AND WHAT'S NEXT?

What's Going Well?

- ✓ Students love learning – Engagement levels are high, and students take pride in their work.
- ✓ Maths progress is strong, with 90% of students on track and developing strong number knowledge and problem-solving skills.
- ✓ Reading skills are solid, with 100% of students working within their expected level and confidently engaging with a range of texts.
- ✓ Writing progress is strong, with 80% of students working within or beyond their expected level, developing fluency, structure, and creativity across different genres.
- ✓ Attendance is improving, with 83% of students attending 90% or more of the term, up from 77% in 2023.

What's Next for 2025?

- 📌 Embed the refreshed New Zealand Curriculum (NZC) into our teaching, aligning it with our local curriculum and keeping learning engaging.
- 📌 Continue strengthening Structured Literacy and Numeracy, ensuring every child has the tools to succeed in reading, writing, and maths.
- 📌 Support new and existing students to thrive, fostering a warm, inclusive environment where all ākonga feel a sense of belonging.
